

# Issues maintain status quo

*Certified election results in*

A review of 804 provisional ballots Wednesday by the board of elections did not change any local issues results. Logan County Board of Elections officials reported following the certification of votes:

Indian Lake Schools' five year 5.7-mill emergency levy still achieved voter approval, 2,841 to 2,770. Unofficial voting was 2,755 to 2,700.

**The Logan County Health District's 10-year 1-mill operating levy request failed 11,022 to 10,574 votes (10,671 to 10,249).**

Riverside Schools' 1.25 percent earned income tax levy was voted down 1,076 to 780 votes, or 57.97 percent to 42.03 percent (1,039 to 760).

Also, Republican presidential candidate John McCain still bested President-Elect Barack Obama in Logan County, with 13,848, or 62.15 percent of the Logan County vote. Mr. Obama received 7,936, or 35.61 percent of the local vote, according to official results (McCain, 13,440 votes; Obama, 7,615; unofficial).

Additionally, the board also approved pre-election campaign finance reports, with the exception of the report for sheriff's candidate Ron Murray, which had missing receipts. This item was tabled for next month's meeting, 8:30 a.m. Thursday, Dec. 18.

The 2009 budget was discussed and a post-election audit date was set for 5:30 p.m. Tuesday.
