

LCHD no longer conducting seasonal flu clinics

The Logan County Health District is no longer conducting special seasonal flu clinics because the agency ran out of its injectable vaccine for adults Thursday afternoon.

The LCHD will not receive any additional doses of the injectable adult vaccine, Kay Schroer, interim nursing director said this morning.

However, ample supplies of the childhood injectable seasonal flu vaccine for ages 6 months to 18 years are available, along with limited quantities of thimerisol-free pediatric vaccines for children ages 6 months to 3 months and FluMist inhalant vaccines for ages 2 to 18. The immunizations are available during the regular childhood clinic, from 9 to 11 a.m. Thursdays.

Additionally, 75 doses of the Alfuria injectable vaccine for adults are available for individuals who have no insurance and do not have the ability to pay. Call the health district, 592-9040, for more information about this specific vaccination.
